

DCH Summer Camp Counselors:

Under the direction of the Summer Camp Director and Assistant Camp Director, Counselors are divided into two positions, Head Counselors and Assistant Counselors.

Head Counselors are responsible for implementing the daily schedule for each group, maintaining behavior and safety of all campers within their group and creating a fun experience for all the campers they work with throughout the summer. Additionally Head Counselors are required to communicate with parents when necessary in regards to behavior issues, injury-related situations and general reports on the camper's day. Head Counselors also supervise and help train their Assistant Counselors throughout the summer. Head Counselors are generally 18 years of age or older with some camp work experience (but is not a requirement) and are required to be First Aid & CPR certified (a training we will provide if not currently certified).

Assistant Counselors are responsible for assisting head counselors in implementing the daily schedule for each group, maintaining behavior and safety of all campers within their group and creating a fun experience for all the campers they work with throughout the summer. Additionally, Assistant Counselors may be called upon to fill in for a Head Counselor from time to time when the situation calls for it. Assistant Counselors must be 16 years of age or older and although are not required to be First Aid & CPR certified are encouraged to be (a training we will provide if not currently certified).

The DCH Summer Camp program runs for 11 weeks each summer. Not all staff are required to work weeks 1 & 11. Camp staff are allotted an additional 5 days off per summer. Some weeks are also not fully enrolled and during those weeks hours are not guaranteed for all staff.
