Rate Includes:

- A lifeguard dedicated to your party to organize pool games, as well as assist you with set-up and clean-up
- Up to three reserved picnic tables underneath the pavilion.
- Up to 25 *people* (including ALL attendees – parents, non-swimmers, etc.)
If you wish to have more people (no more than 35) in attendance there will be an additional \$50 fee
- Each party attendee will receive a pool day pass for future use
- Exclusive use of pool party toys and pool items

Rules Specific for Parties:

- There must be at least 1 adult present on the pool deck whenever a party guest is in the pool
- All children who cannot swim must be accompanied by an adult at all times
- You may bring your own food and drink for the event but it must stay at the picnic tables under the pavilion. No alcoholic beverages or beverages in glass bottles.
- All children who wish to go in the deep-end must take a 'Deep-end Test'
- 5 days prior to the party a full guest list must be sent to Ann at info@dedhamcommunityhouse.org
- In addition to following these party rules we ask that you also adhere to all pool rules listed below:

DEDHAM COMMUNITY HOUSE POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **FOOD IS NOT ALLOWED ON THE POOL DECK!** Please use the pavilion area for picnicking purposes. Glass bottles are also not allowed on deck.
- **All children must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times,** regardless of swimming ability. The lifeguards are responsible for monitoring the pool area and should **NOT** be viewed as babysitters.
- **No one under the age of 16 may be left at the pool alone.**
- Every person must wear a **clean bathing suit AND take a cleansing shower before entering the pool.**
- Children who are not toilet trained may enter the pool if they are wearing **swim diapers**. Please take children to the bathroom frequently and change swim diapers often. Swim diapers are also available for purchase in the concessions office.
- The pool has a limited capacity set by the Department of Health. Lifeguards will begin rotation if capacity is reached.
- **No sick or infected bathers** are allowed in the pool. No open cuts or wounds.
- Please see the lifeguards if first aid is required.
- **All swimmers with shoulder length or longer hair must put it into an elastic or wear a swim cap.**
- **All children under age 12 must take and pass the deep end test** in order to enter the deep end. Testing of **older swimmers** may be requested at the lifeguard's discretion.
- **NO PLAYING WITH OR EXCESSIVE USE OF THE SHOWERS!!** They are for rinsing off before and after swimming only. The shower bench is for handicap use only.
- **No climbing the fence** or otherwise using any of the facilities for uses other than they are intended.
- Please **no playing on the stairs or railings** in the pool.
- **No swimmies, water wings or other inflatable devices used to assist in swimming are allowed (inflatable noodles are allowed).** Life/swim vests and bubbles are ok.
- **Only toys intended for a pool are allowed in the pool. No hard balls. No torpedoes. Nothing made of foam.**
- The **kickboards and noodles** at the pool are **reserved for swim lesson usage only** so please bring your own toys.
- No diving.
- No spitting.
- No rough play.
- No dangerous objects.
- No smoking or Alcoholic beverages.
- No running.

*The lifeguards are in complete authority of the pool and enforcing the rules.
They are there for you and your child's safety.*
